Randy Bracken, 71, passed away on Monday, October 4, 2010 at Methodist West Hospital in West Des Moines. Funeral services will be 10:30 a.m. Friday at West Des Moines Christian Church with burial at Resthaven Cemetery.

Randy was born August 9, 1939 in Fort Dodge, Iowa to Lester and Evelyn Bracken. He worked at the Meredith Corporation as a Pressman for 19 years.
