Robert "Bobby Joe" Joseph Willeke was born the son of Donna Wuebker and Donald Willeke in Carroll, Iowa, on August 23, 1955, and died unexpectedly at his home on Nov. 4, 2002, at the age of 47.

He also worked part-time at his father's service station for more than 40 years.

Bobby loved the fire department and first responders. He especially enjoyed fire schools and conventions. He was always eager to grab the hose for a good "water fight" at any local contest, as well as at the State Fair. He spent many a hot day at the State Fair's "Hall of Flame" in a Smokey the Bear suit shaking hands with children. When he died, Bobby was serving as a councilman for the city of Dexter.
